FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS)

3.

May 11, 1999: Penal Code Section 470(A) (felony)

On or about May 11, 1999, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. LA031714, Respondent pled *nolo contendere* to and was convicted for violation of PC Section 470(A) (forgery of a document), a felony. On or about June 16, 1999, Respondent was sentenced to three (3) years formal probation and ordered to serve ninety (90) days in jail and pay restitution to the victim in the amount of \$200.00. On or about December 12, 2000, Respondent admitted to violation of probation, and probation was revoked, then reinstated with the modification to order Respondent to perform ten (10) days of Cal Trans service. On or about August 16, 2002, probation was ordered terminated pursuant to Penal Code ("PC") 1203.3 and Respondent's plea and conviction were set aside; a plea of not guilty was entered; the offense was reduced to a misdemeanor; and the case was dismissed pursuant to PC 1203.4.

December 12, 2000: Vehicle Code Section 10752 211 (Misdemeanor)

On or about December 12, 2000, in the Superior Court of the State of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 0GL03400, Respondent pled *nolo contendere* to and was convicted for violation of Vehicle Code ("VC") Section 10752 (illegal possession/sale of a vehicle identification number), a misdemeanor. On the same day, Respondent was sentenced to three (3) years summary probation and ordered to perform ten (10) days of Cal Trans service and pay fines and assessments. On or about July 16, 2002, probation was ordered terminated pursuant to PC 1203.3. On or about August 13, 2002, Respondent's plea was set aside; a plea of not guilty was entered; and the complaint was dismissed. As part of the court's PC 1203.4

1	dismissal, Respondent was required to disclose the conviction "in response to any direct
2	question contained in any questionnaire or application for public office or for licensure by any
3	state or local agency"

5	These crimes, by their facts and circumstances, bear a substantial relationship to
6	the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10,
7	Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

9	The crimes of which Respondent was convicted constitute cause for denial of
10	Respondent's application for a real estate license under California Business and Professions
11	Code Sections 475(a)(2), 480(a)(1), and 10177(b).

13	(FAILURE TO DISCLOSE)

1.5	In response to Question 28 of his August 15, 2016 application, to wit: "HAVE
16	YOU EVER BEEN CONVICTED (SEE PARAGRAPH ABOVE ¹) OF ANY VIOLATION OF
L7	THE LAW AT THE MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY LEVEL? IF YES, COMPLETE ITEM
18	34 WITH INFORMATION ON EACH CONVICTION." Respondent answered "No," and
19	revealed neither of the convictions described in Paragraphs 3 and 4, above; Respondent did not
20	reveal anywhere on his application the convictions described in Paragraphs 3 and 4, above.

24	The BRE's RE 435 Real Estate Salesperson application includes in the "Background Information" section a box
:5	that contains information regarding "Convicted" categories. "Convicted" includes:"Convictions expunged under Penal Code sections 1203.4, 1203.4a and 1203.41 or equivalent non-California statue must still be disclosed. Proof that a conviction has been expunged under Penal Code sections 1203.4, 1203.4a and 1203.41 must be submitted with the application."
17	CalBRE Statement of Issues – Edmond Akopyan
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Respondent's failure to reveal the convictions set forth herein in Paragraphs 3 and 4 on his August 15, 2016 real estate salesperson license application constitutes the attempt to procure a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or by knowingly making a false statement of material fact required to be revealed in said application, and constitutes cause under Code Sections 475(a)(1), 480(d) and 10177(a) for the denial of Respondent's real estate license application under the Real Estate Law.

9.

These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of the California Government Code.

WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent, EDMOND AKOPYAN, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
