LEE HUMPREY DURST (hereinafter referred to as 22 "Respondent") is presently licensed and/or has license rights 23 under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business 24 and Professions Code, hereinafter referred to as the "Code"). 25 111 26

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3. Respondent was licensed by the Bureau of Real Estate of the State of California as a real estate broker effective December 20, 1985. The license expires September 15, 2018.

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4. On or about July 29, 2016, the Supreme Court of California in case no. S234491 ordered that Respondent be suspended from the practice of law for three years, suspension be stayed, and Respondent placed on probation for four years subject to the following conditions:

- a. Respondent to be suspended from the practice of law for a minimum of the first two years.
  - b. Comply with other conditions as ordered.
- 5. Respondent performed multiple acts of misconduct including failure to deposit, misappropriation, failure to maintain records, dishonesty, failure to account, and failure to cooperate in the investigation.
- 6. Respondent's license discipline alleged in Paragraph 4 is cause under Code Section 10177(f) for suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

Business and Professions Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to

exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action on the license and license rights of Respondent LEE HUMPHREY DURST, for the cost of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code) and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
