All references to the "Code" are to the California Business and Professions 19 Code, all references to the "Real Estate Law" are to Part 1 of Division 4 of the Code, and all 20 references to "Regulations" are to Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations. 21 22 2. Respondent is presently licensed and/or has license rights under the Real Estate 23 Law as a real estate salesperson. Respondent was originally licensed as a real estate 24 salesperson on June 25, 2015, and his license is due to expire on June 24, 2019. 25 26 27 ///

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

3.

On or about January 21, 2016, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, in Case No. 5DY07212, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code Section 368(c) (Elder Abuse - Great Bodily Harm Not Likely), a misdemeanor. This crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee under Regulation 2910.

4.

Respondent's criminal conviction, as described above, constitutes cause under Code Sections 490 and 10177(b) for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

5.

Respondent did not report the conviction in writing to the Bureau of Real Estate ("Bureau") within 30 days, in violation of Code Section 10186.2.

6.

Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement of the case.
