The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, for cause of accusation against JOEL ARELLANO-AGUILAR, alleges as follows:

1. The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

2. JOEL ARELLANO-AGUILAR (hereinafter referred to as "Respondent") presently has license rights under the Real Estate Law (Part 1 of Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code, hereinafter referred to as the "Code").

3. Respondent was licensed by the Bureau of Real Estate of the State of California as a real estate broker effective February 23, 2007.

4. On or about June 12, 2017, in the County of Orange, Superior Court of California, case No. 16CM10549MA, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code section 487(A) (theft).

5. The above referenced matter bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real estate licensee, Title 10, Chapter 6, Section 2910, California Administrative Code.

6. Respondent failed to report the conviction to the Bureau which conduct subjects his real estate license to disciplinary action under sections 10186.2 and 10177(d) of the Code.

7. Respondent's conviction alleged in Paragraphs 4 is cause under Code Sections 490 and 10177(b) for suspension or revocation of all licenses and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.
