1	State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

3	Respondent presently has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of
4	Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate
5	salesperson (License ID 01892599). Respondent's license is scheduled to expire on March 12,
6	2019, unless renewed.
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FIRST CAUSE OF ACCUSATION

(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

3.

On or about February 27, 2017, in the Superior Court of California, County of Riverside, Case No. RIF1603111, Respondent was convicted on a plea of guilty for violation of Penal Code section 415(2) (disturbing the peace), a misdemeanor. In part, Respondent was placed on summary probation for 60 months on certain terms and conditions, including commitment to the custody of the Riverside County Sheriff for 2 days, with credit for time served of 2 actual days, ordered not to be an IHSS (In Home Supportive Services) paid caregiver for any elder or dependent adult except for any family member, and payment of fees and fines.

4.

The conviction, as described in Paragraph 3 above, bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crime of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause under Sections 490 and 10177(b) of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACCUSATION (FAILURE TO REPORT CONVICTION)

6.

Pursuant to Section 10186.2 of the Code, a licensee shall report, in writing, "the conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any felony or misdemeanor" to the Department of Real Estate ("Department") within thirty (30) days of the conviction. Respondent failed to report in writing to the Bureau the conviction described in Paragraph 3 above, within thirty (30) days of the conviction date.

ACCUSATION

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Respondent's failure to timely report the conviction constitutes cause under Section 10186.2 of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

(COSTS OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT)

8.

California Business and Professions Code section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Bureau of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

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WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent ANNAZETTE SHILLINGS under the Real Estate Law, for the costs of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
