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16	The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State
17	of California, acting in her official capacity, for Statement of Issues against AMANDA
18	MICHELE MILLER ("Respondent") alleges as follows:

20	On or about August 21, 2018, Respondent made application to the Department
21	of Real Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson license.

4	On or about August 1, 2006, in the Superior Court of Arizona, County of
5	Maricopa, case no. CR2006-137060-001, Respondent was convicted of violating A.R.S.
6	sections 13-1203, 13-1204, 13-707, and 13-802 (aggravated assault), a misdemeanor. In part,
7	Respondent was sentenced to serve one (1) year of probation and pay various fines and fees.
8	Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a real
9	estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.
10	3.
11	On or about September 10, 2010, in the Scottsdale City Court, State of Arizona,
12	case no. M-0751-CR-2010009661, Respondent was convicted of violating A.R.S. sections 13-
13	1203(A)(3) (assault) and 13-2904(A)(1) (disorderly conduct/disturbance), both misdemeanors.
14	In part, Respondent was sentenced to attend an alcohol education/treatment program and pay
15	various fines and fees. Said crimes bear a substantial relationship to the qualifications,
16	functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California
17	Code of Regulations.
18	4.
19	On or about May 14, 2012, in the Justice Court, Las Vegas Township, County of
20	Clark, Nevada, case no. 11M45352X, Respondent was convicted of violating N.R.S. section
21	201.354 (soliciting prostitution), a misdemeanor. In part, Respondent was sentenced to attend
22	aid counseling. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or
23	duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of
24	Regulations.
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1	5.
2	On or about October 3, 2012, in the Phoenix Municipal Court, State of Arizona,
3	case no. 14357030, Respondent was convicted of violating A.R.S. section 28-1381(A)(1)
4	(driving under the influence), a misdemeanor. In part, Respondent was sentenced to attend ten
5	(10) days of Screening and Assessment Services ("SAS") counseling and pay various fines and
6	fees. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a
7	real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.
8	6.
9	On or about September 23, 2014, in the Superior Court of Arizona, County of
10	Maricopa, case no. CR2013-446125-001, Respondent was convicted of violating A.R.S.
11	sections 13-1001, 13-2510, 13-2512, 13-604, 13-701, 13-702, 13-707, 13-801, and 13-802
12	(attempted hindering prosecution), a felony. In part, Respondent was sentenced to serve two (2)
13	years of probation, complete 25 hours of community restitution, serve one (1) month in jail, and
14	pay various fines and fees. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications,
15	functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California
16	Code of Regulations.
17	7.
18	On or about January 23, 2015, in the Scottsdale City Court, State of Arizona,
19	case no. M-0751-SC-2014006444, Respondent was convicted of violating A.R.S. section 13-
20	3214(A) (prostitution), a misdemeanor. In part, Respondent was sentenced to serve 30 days of
21	confinement with 15 days suspended and 15 days served, serve probation for 11 months, and
22	pay various fines and fees. Said crime bears a substantial relationship to the qualifications,
23	functions, or duties of a real estate licensee under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California
24	Code of Regulations.
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1	8.
2	The crimes of which Respondent was convicted as alleged above constitute
3	cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under California Business
4	and Professions Code sections 475(a)(2), 480(a), and 10177(b).
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6	SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION
7	(FAILURE TO REVEAL CONVICTIONS)
8	9.
9	In response to Question 28 of her license application, to wit: "HAVE YOU
10	EVER BEEN CONVICTED (SEE PARAGRAPH ABOVE) OF ANY VIOLATION OF THE
11	LAW AT THE MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY LEVEL? IF YES, COMPLETE ITEM 34
12	WITH INFORMATION ON EACH CONVICTION," Respondent answered, "Yes," but failed
13	to reveal the convictions described in Paragraphs 3, 4, and 5, above.
14	10.
15	Respondent's failure to reveal these convictions in her license application
16	constitutes knowingly making a false statement of material facts required to be revealed in said
17	application, which is grounds for denial of the issuance of a license under California Business
18	and Professions Code sections 475(a)(1), 480(d), and 10177(a).
19	These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division
20	4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through
21	11528 of the California Government Code.
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WHEREFORE, the Complainant prays that the above-entitled matter be set for hearing and, upon proof of the charges contained herein, that the Commissioner refuse to authorize the issuance of, and deny the issuance of, a real estate salesperson license to Respondent AMANDA MICHELE MILLER and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
