STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Respondent.

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The Complainant, Maria Suarez, a Supervising Special Investigator for the Department of Real Estate ("Department") of the State of California, for cause of for Statement of Issues against JEFFREY JAMES HELLIGAR ("Respondent"), is informed and alleges in her official capacity as follows:

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1. On or about September 18, 2018, Respondent made application to the Department for a real estate salesperson license.

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FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL

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(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS)

On or about February 19, 1991, in the Ninth Judicial Circuit Court of Osceola

County, Florida, Case No. CR 90-952, Respondent was convicted on a plea of guilty for violation

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of Florida Statute 784.045(1)(b) (aggravated battery), a felony in the second degree. The court sentenced Respondent to serve a 30-month prison sentence, with credit for one day, and ordered

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Respondent to pay restitution in the amount of \$9,355.63.

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STATEMENT OF ISSUES

- 3. On or about October 4, 1993, in the Circuit Court of Orange County, Florida, Case No. CR 93-5261, Respondent was convicted on a plea of nolo contendere to violation of Florida Statute 893.13(1)(a)(1) (delivery of cocaine), a felony in the second degree. The court sentenced Respondent to 1 day time served in the Orange County Jail, followed by one year of probation with conditions, and ordered Respondent to pay costs and fees.
- 4. On or about February 13, 1995, in the Circuit Court of Orange County, Florida, Case No. CR 94-11444, Respondent was convicted on a plea of nolo contendere to violation of Florida Statute 893.13(1)(a) (possession of cannabis with intent to sell), a felony in the third degree. The court placed Respondent on 2 years of supervised probation under the supervision of the Department of Corrections, and ordered Respondent to pay fines and costs.
- 5. The crimes for which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraphs 2 through 4 above, by their facts and circumstances, bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.
- 6. The crimes for which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraphs 2 through 4 above, constitute cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under California Business and Professions Code sections 480(a)(1) and 10177(b).

SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL

(FAILURE TO DISCLOSE CONVICTIONS)

- 7. On or about September 18, 2018, Respondent made application to the Department for a real estate salesperson license. In response to Question 28, under "BACKGROUND INFORMATION," of Respondent's license application, to wit, "HAVE YOU EVER BEEN CONVICTED (SEE PARAGRAPH ABOVE) OF ANY VIOLATION OF THE LAW AT THE MISDEMEANOR OR FELONY LEVEL? IF YES, COMPLETE ITEM 34 WITH INFORMATION ON EACH CONVICTION," Respondent marked "NO."
- 8. Respondent's failure to disclose the convictions, as set forth in Paragraphs 2 through 4 above, in his license application constitutes an attempt to procure a real estate license by fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or by making a material misstatement of fact in an application,
