17	The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of
18	California, for Statement of Issues against LESA ASHLEY DANIELSON, a.k.a. "Lesa
19	Danielson," "Lesa A. Danielson," and "Lesa Pollaro" ("Respondent"), is informed and alleges
20	in her official capacity as follows:
21	1.
22	On or about June 29, 2020, Respondent made application to the Department of Real
23	Estate of the State of California for a real estate salesperson exam and license.
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(CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS)

2.

On or about May 11, 2018, in the Superior Court of Arizona, County of Maricopa, Case No. CR2016-150031-001, Respondent was convicted on pleas of guilty for violating the following:

- (a) Arizona Revised Statutes ("A.R.S.") sections 13-105, 13-1201, 28-3001, 28-3304, 28-3305, 28-3306, 28-3315, 12-114.01, 12-116.04, 12-116.09, 12-269, 13-604, 13-610, 13-701, 13-702, and 13-801 (endangerment), a felony; and
- (b) A.R.S. sections 28-1381(a)(1), 28-1381(i) and (j), 28-1387(b) and (c), 28-1444, 28-1461, 28-3001, 28-3306, 28-3315, 28-3319, 12-116.01, 12-116.02, 12-116.04, 41-1723, 41-1651, 13-707, and 13-802 (driving or actual physical control while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs), a misdemeanor.

The court suspended the imposition or execution of sentence and placed Respondent on supervised probation for three (3) years under certain terms and conditions, including 30 days in county jail, 30 hours of community restitution, completion of substance abuse evaluation and treatment as directed, completion of mental health treatment as directed and take medications as prescribed, and payment of fines and fees.

3.

On or about January 12, 2016, in the City Court of Scottsdale, County of Maricopa, State of Arizona, Case No. TR2015018158, Respondent was convicted on a plea of guilty for violating A.R.S. section 28-1381(a)(1) (First DUI liquor/drugs/vapors/combo), a misdemeanor. The court sentenced Respondent to 10 days in jail and ordered her to attend an alcohol abuse screening, complete all treatment as recommended, and pay fines and fees.

On or about August 4, 2014, in the City Court of Scottsdale, County of Maricopa, State of Arizona, Case No. SC2014007372, Respondent was convicted on a plea of guilty for

 violating A.R.S. section 13-2908(a)(1) (criminal nuisance-endangers), a misdemeanor. The court ordered Respondent to complete an alcohol program and to pay fines and fees.

5.

On or about December 2, 2013, in the Superior Court of Arizona, County of Maricopa, Case No. CR2013-428666-001, Respondent was convicted on a plea of guilty for violating A.R.S. sections 13-1002, 13-3401, 13-3407, 13-3418, 13-604, 13-701, 13-702, 13-707, 13-801, 13-802, and 13-901.01(a) and (d) (solicitation to commit possession or use of dangerous drugs), a felony. The court suspended the execution of sentence and placed Respondent on 18 months of probation under certain terms and conditions, including payment of restitution, fines and fees.

6.

The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraphs 2 through 5 above, by their facts and circumstances, bear a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, of the California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

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The crimes of which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraphs 2 through 5 above, constitute cause for denial of Respondent's application for a real estate license under California Business and Professions Code sections 475(a)(2), 480(a)(1) and 10177(b).

(IN AGGRAVATION)

8.

On or about May 11, 2009, in the Superior Court of Arizona, County of Maricopa, Case No. TR2008171553, Respondent was convicted for violating A.R.S. section 28-1382(a)(1) for extreme DUI with BAC of .15% or more. Respondent failed to notify the Arizona Department of real Estate in writing within ten (10) days of her May 11, 2009 conviction.

According to the San Marcos Justice Court, said court records were purged on January 2, 2020.
