The Complainant, Jason Parson, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against HEREN MUKESH SAGAR, a.k.a. "Heren Sagar" ("Respondent"), alleges as follows:

1.

The Complainant, Jason Parson, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, makes this Accusation in his official capacity.

2.

Respondent presently has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate salesperson (License ID 01733510). Respondent's license is set to expire on August 27, 2023, unless renewed.

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(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)

3.

On or about July 9, 2021, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 0GD02403, Respondent was convicted, on a plea of no contest, for violation of Penal Code section 647(a) (disorderly conduct: lewd act), a misdemeanor. The court suspended the imposition of sentence and placed Respondent on summary probation for 12 months, under certain terms and conditions, including in part, one (1) day in county jail, completion of a 26-week approved adult sexual offender treatment program, and payment of fines and fees.

4.

The conviction, as described in Paragraph 3 above, bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crime for which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause under Code sections 490 and 10177(b) for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

(FAILURE TO REPORT CONVICTION)

6.

Pursuant to Section 10186.2 of the Code, a licensee shall report, in writing, "the conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any felony or misdemeanor" to the Department of Real Estate ("Department") within thirty (30) days of the conviction. Respondent failed to report in writing to the Department the conviction described in Paragraph 3 above, within thirty (30) days of the conviction date.

7.

Respondent's failure to timely report the conviction described in Paragraph 3 above constitutes cause under Section 10186.2 of the Code for the suspension or revocation of

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the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

(IN AGGRAVATION)

8.

On or about August 16, 2013, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 3GN01330, Respondent was convicted, on a plea of no contest, for violating Vehicle Code section 23152(b) (DUI with BAC of .08% or more), a misdemeanor. The court suspended the imposition of sentence and placed Respondent on summary probation for five (5) years, under certain terms and conditions, including in part, serving 120 days in county jail, 15 days of community labor, completion of a 18-month licensed second-offender alcohol and other drug education and counseling program, completion of an SB-38 alcohol program, completion of the Hospital and Morgue (HAM) program and the Victim Impact Panel (VIP) of Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), installation of an ignition interlock device for two (2) years, completion of 52 Alcoholics Anonymous meetings, and payment of fines and fees. The court declared Respondent as a habitual traffic offender and disallowed issuance by DMV of a restricted driver's license.

9.

On or about July 23, 2012, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. 2GN02199, Respondent was convicted, on a plea of no contest, for violating Vehicle Code section 23103 (reckless driving), a misdemeanor. The court suspended the imposition of sentence and placed Respondent on summary probation for 48 months, under certain terms and conditions, including in part, completion of a 18-month licensed second-offender alcohol and other drug education and counseling program, completion of an SB-38 alcohol program, and payment of fines and fees.

10.

On or about February 9, 2006, in the Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. GA063565, Respondent was convicted, on a plea of guilty, for violating Vehicle Code section 23152(a) (DUI), and convicted, on a plea of no contest, for violating

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Penal Code section 69 (resisting peace officer), both misdemeanors. The court suspended the imposition of sentence and placed Respondent on formal probation for 3 years, under certain terms and conditions, including in part, completion of a 52-week anger management counseling program, 30 days of Cal-Trans, and payment of fines and fees.

(COSTS OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT)

11.

California Business and Professions Code section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

12.

These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 11528 of the California Government Code.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of Respondent HEREN MUKESH SAGAR under the Real Estate Law, for the costs of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
