19	The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Supervising Special Investigator of the

23	and all references to "Regulations" are to Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations.

26	a. At all times herein mentioned, Respondent was and still is licensed and/or has
27	license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and

1	Professions Code, as a real estate salesperson ("RES"), Department of Real Estate <sup>1</sup>
2	("Department") license ID 01068237.
3	b. The Department originally issued Respondent's RES license on or about
4	March 10, 1990.
5	c. Respondent's RES license will expire on April 26, 2027, unless renewed.
6	CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
7	(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)
8	4.
9	June 28, 2023; Penal Code ("PC") Sections 530.5 and 368(e)(1) - Misdemeanors
LO	a. On or about December 23, 2021, in the Superior Court of California,
11	Riverside County, in Case No. INF2102272, entitled The People of the State of California v.
12	Cheryl Marie Rush et. al., a felony complaint was brought against Respondent for violation of
13	(1) PC Section 530.5 (identity theft), a felony, (2) PC Section 368(d)(1) (elder abuse – fraud
14	and embezzlement), a felony, and (3) PC Section 368(e)(1) (elder abuse – fraud and
15	embezzlement above \$950), a felony.
16	b. On or about June 28, 2023, the charges were reduced to misdemeanors and
17	Respondent pled to and was convicted for violation of (1) PC Section 530.5 (identity theft), a
18	misdemeanor, and (2) PC Section 368(e)(1) (elder abuse – fraud and embezzlement above
19	\$950), a misdemeanor.
20	c. Also on or about June 28, 2023, the Court suspended the imposition of
21	sentence and placed Respondent on summary probation for 12 months under certain terms and
22	conditions, including, in part, 1 day jail, payment of restitution, stay away from victim, and
23	payment of fines and fees.

d. On or about July 22, 2024, the conviction was expunged per PC 1203.4. 1 5. 2 The crimes of which Respondent were convicted, in Paragraph 4, by their facts 3 4 and circumstances, bear substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee 5 and constitutes cause under Code Sections 490 and 10177(b) for the suspension or revocation 6 of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law. 7 SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 8 (FAILURE TO REPORT) 9 6. 10 Respondent did not report in writing to the Department of a felony complaint 11 being brought against her within thirty (30) days (December 23, 2021). 12 7. 13 Respondent's failure to report the felony complaint against her constitutes a 14 cause for discipline under Code Section 10186.22 of the license and license rights of 15 Respondent under the Real Estate Law. 16 8. 17 These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 18 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 19 11528 of the California Government Code. 20 /// 21 /// 22 /// 23 24 <sup>2</sup> Pursuant to Business and Professions Code 10186,2: (a)(1) A licensee shall report any of the following to the 25 department: (A) The bringing of an indictment or information charging a felony against the licensee. (B) The conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any felony or 26 misdemeanor. (c) Any disciplinary action taken by another licensing entity or authority of this state or of another state or an agency of the federal government. (2) The report required by this subdivision shall be made in writing within 30 days of the date of the bringing of the indictment or the charging of a felony, the conviction, or the

disciplinary action. (b) Failure to make a report required by this section shall constitute a cause for discipline.
