3	b. The Department originally issued Respondent's RES license on or about
4	November 5, 2005.
5	c. Respondent's RES license will expire on October 9, 2027, unless renewed.
6	CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
7	(CRIMINAL CONVICTION)
8	4.
9	December 8, 2021; Health and Safety Code ("HSC") Section 11378 - Felony
10	a. On or about August 16, 2021, in the Superior Court of California, Ventura
11	County, in Case No. 2021021212, entitled The People of the State of California v. Gregory
12	Glen Wold, a felony complaint was brought against Respondent for violation of (1) HSC
13	Section 11351 (possession of a controlled substance, to wit, heroin), a felony, (2) HSC Section
14	11378 (possession of a controlled substance, to wit, methamphetamine), a felony, and (3) Pena
15	Code Section 466 (possession of burglar's tools), a misdemeanor.
16	b. On or about December 8, 2021, Respondent pled guilty to and was convicted
17	for violation of HSC Section 11378 (possession of a controlled substance, to wit,
18	methamphetamine), a felony.
19	c. On or about January 7, 2022, the Court suspended the imposition of sentence
20	and placed Respondent on formal probation for 24 months under certain terms and conditions,
21	including, in part, 180 days jail, participate in Drug Court Program, driver's license revocation
22	and payment of fines and fees.

24	The crime of which Respondent was convicted, in Paragraph 4, by its facts and
25	circumstances, bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6,

California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee 1 and constitutes cause under Code Sections 490 and 10177(b) for the suspension or revocation 2 of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law. 3 SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 4 (FAILURE TO REPORT) 5 6. 6 Respondent did not report in writing to the Department of a felony complaint 7 being brought against him within thirty (30) days (August 16, 2021). 8 7. 9 Respondent did not report in writing to the Department of his conviction within 10 thirty (30) days of the conviction date (December 8, 2021). 11 12 Respondent's failure to report the felony complaint against him and his 13 conviction constitutes causes for discipline under Code Section 10186.22 of the license and 14 license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law. 15 9. 16 These proceedings are brought under the provisions of Section 10100, Division 17 4 of the Business and Professions Code of the State of California and Sections 11500 through 18 19 11528 of the California Government Code. COSTS 20 10. 21 Code Section 10106 provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in 22 resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department, the Commissioner may request 23 24 ² Pursuant to Business and Professions Code 10186.2: (a)(1) A licensee shall report any of the following to the 25 department: (A) The bringing of an indictment or information charging a felony against the licensee. (B) The conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any felony or 26 misdemeanor. (c) Any disciplinary action taken by another licensing entity or authority of this state or of another state or an agency of the federal government. (2) The report required by this subdivision shall be made in writing

within 30 days of the date of the bringing of the indictment or the charging of a felony, the conviction, or the disciplinary action. (b) Failure to make a report required by this section shall constitute a cause for discipline.
