The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, for cause of Accusation against TERRILL ANDRE WRIGHT ("Respondent") alleges as follows:

1.

The Complainant, Veronica Kilpatrick, a Supervising Special Investigator of the State of California, makes this Accusation in her official capacity.

2.

Respondent presently has license rights under the Real Estate Law, Part 1 of Division 4 of the California Business and Professions Code ("Code"), as a real estate salesperson with Department of Real Estate ("Department") License ID 02165676.

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CRIMINAL CONVICTION

3.

a. On or about July 31, 2023, in the Superior Court of California, County of Riverside, Case No. Case No. SWF2301112, the State of California filed a Felony Complaint against Respondent alleging Respondent violated Penal Code sections 33215 (manufacture, offer, or possess a short-barreled rifle), 30605(a) (possess an assault weapon), and 273d(a) (inflict cruel and inhuman corporal punishment and injury upon a child), felonies.

b. On or about November 4, 2024, in Case No. SWF2301112, Respondent was convicted on a plea of guilty to a violation of Penal Code section 242 (battery), a misdemeanor. The court suspended the imposition of sentence and placed Respondent on summary probation for twelve (12) months. The court ordered Respondent to serve ninety (90) days in custody, eighty-six (86) days of which to be served in a work release program.

The conviction, as described in Paragraph 3(b) above, bears a substantial relationship under Section 2910, Title 10, Chapter 6, of the California Code of Regulations to the qualifications, functions or duties of a real estate licensee.

5.

The crime for which Respondent was convicted, as described in Paragraph 3 above, constitutes cause under Code sections 490 and 10177(b) for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

FAILURE TO REPORT FELONY COMPLAINT AND CONVICTION

6.

Pursuant to Section 10186.2 of the Code, a licensee shall report, in writing, "[t]he bringing of a criminal complaint, information, or indictment charging a felony against the licensee" and "[t]he conviction of the licensee, including any verdict of guilty, or plea of guilty or no contest, of any felony or misdemeanor" to the Department within thirty (30) days of the date of conviction. Respondent failed to timely report in writing to the Department the felony complaint and conviction described in Paragraph 3 above.

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Respondent's failure to timely report the felony complaint and conviction described in Paragraph 3 above constitutes cause under Section 10186.2 of the Code for the suspension or revocation of the license and license rights of Respondent under the Real Estate Law.

COSTS OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT

8.

California Business and Professions Code section 10106, provides, in pertinent part, that in any order issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the Department of Real Estate, the Commissioner may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation of this part to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays that a hearing be conducted on the allegations of this Accusation and that upon proof thereof, a decision be rendered imposing disciplinary action against all the licenses and license rights of TERRILL ANDRE WRIGHT under the Real Estate Law, for the costs of investigation and enforcement as permitted by law, and for such other and further relief as may be proper under other applicable provisions of law.
